LETTER FROM THE CEO


2024 – 2025 was a transformational year for TGR Foundation. From expanding our educational programming to extending our footprint on the East Coast, we made great progress toward Tiger's vision of empowering more students through education. We celebrated the opening of our second TGR Learning Lab in West Philadelphia. We also announced exciting new partnerships with Augusta National Golf Club to bring a Learning Lab to Augusta, Georgia and with Liberty National Foundation to create an endowed cohort of Earl Woods Scholars in the New York and New Jersey region. Our flagship Learning Lab in Anaheim, California revitalized its STEAM educational enrichment and golf programs, and we piloted our new teen career readiness strategy at both Labs with positive early outcomes. In total, we saw an 86% increase in total program participants. All of this tremendous growth and impact would not have been possible without the incredible support from our community. On April 1, 2025, the Smilow Woodland TGR Learning Lab first welcomed students inside the building for a soft opening. The 30,000-square-foot facility was built in partnership with Cobbs Creek Foundation and capital campaign lead donors, the Smilow Foundation and the Woodland family. Since opening, the Learning Lab has provided thousands of first-through 12th-grade students in Philadelphia a wide range of educational offerings, including tutoring, school-day field trips, after-school classes and academic support, along with college and career readiness resources.

Through our education programs, local students in our Learning Lab communities explored a wide variety of subjects, including science, technology, engineering, arts and mathematics (STEAM) and how they are integrated in school and life. From early elementary programs helping Philadelphia families learn math through games to esports tournaments, career panels and a STEAM Carnival, our programs helped students experience the joy of learning.

ENHANCING OUR STEAM PROGRAMMING

During the 2024 - 2025 academic year, our TGR Learning Labs introduced several new program offerings and special events to reach more students. STEAM-based clubs and teams allowed high school students to explore subjects aligned with their interests, while studios provided an intensive real-world learning experience aligned with career opportunities.









IMPACT SPOTLIGHT: Esports

Expanding opportunities for young Esports enthusiasts, the TGR Learning Lab Anaheim united students in a safe environment on Friday nights throughout the school year for Esports tournaments, allowing students to merge competition with technical skills learned in our after-school classes. In addition to the competitions, students also had an opportunity to visit 2K and learn from professionals during our inaugural summer Career Explorer Academy.







GOLF

Our Junior Golf program provided opportunities for aspiring and seasoned student-athletes to learn and grow their golf skills through a variety of programming, from after-school classes to Saturday workshops and clinics. A new Girls in Golf clinic fostered growth and peer mentorship through a unique golf experience led by current female high-school and college golfers.






TEEN CAREER READINESS STRATEGY


